Jarosław Fret is founder and leader of the company founded on the physical theatre of Grotowski in Poland and the primacy of traditional music in drama. Each show is created through intense ensemble work and draws on ancient ritual and sacred music Eastern Europe and the Middle East. Working closely with Armenian mastersinger Murat Iclincala from St Gregory the Illuminator Church, Istanbul, Vahan Kerovpyan, drummer/composer and Aram Kerovpyan, mastersinger at the Paris Armenian Cathedral and famous musicians from the region they deliver a powerful and haunting show.
